## BULLIVANTS INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM May 2022

Bullivants is proud to announce and congratulate Hayden Wiggins in becoming our new recipient of the Bullivants Indigenous Scholarship Program for 2022. The scholarship grants Hayden a yearly \$10,000 financial support payment for the duration of his degree in Engineering. Funded by the sale of selected Bullivants alloy chain slings, the scholarship program aims to encourage and support Indigenous tertiary students who have a passion for engineering and provide them with hands-on experience in the business.

To qualify for this scholarship, all recipients are to be a full-time Indigenous Australian student working towards an undergraduate degree in Engineering at an accredited Australian university.

Hayden is currently in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of his Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)/Bachelor of Arts degree at The University of Queensland. Hayden's degree focuses on chemical and environmental engineering to help him start a career he is passionate about - innovation in the chemical engineering field and improving the sustainability of the earth.

After already completing an internship with Honeywell, Hayden has picked up some electrical engineering skills and is working on developing his leadership skills. This includes volunteering, taking on leadership positions in university clubs and attending leadership camps. "This scholarship is an excellent opportunity for me to gain hands on experience to improve myself as an engineer", says Hayden.

Bullivants is also continuing to support Caitlin Ramsay, one of the first scholarship recipients. Caitlin started her Engineering degree at UNSW in 2018, joining our program in 2019. This year will be her final year and she will be graduating in early 2023.

Caitlin is currently carrying out her Honours degree working on a genome project at the Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute and has participated in iGEM's synthetic biology competition to design a solution to coral bleaching. She also researched cybersecurity issues during her internship with Data61 x CSIRO x Pawsey. These experiences have allowed Caitlin to develop the point where she feels ready to enter the workforce as a graduate engineer.

"This scholarship has allowed me to move away from home to study my dream degree. Without Bullivants' support I would not be able to solely focus on my studies and would have had to find work to support myself" says Caitlin.


